5. **For Discussion Only:** Discussion About Caregivers Working as Registered Behavior Technicians (RBT) for Their Child with Autism Spectrum Disorder with the Nevada ABA Board (NVABA) and Nevada Association for Behavior Analysis (NABA).

Christy Fuller: She is a NABA analyst, she prepared a statement and will share with the Commission. There is a recent trend to recruit parents as RBTs for their children and then submit for reimbursement for those ABA treatment hours. There are differences in the billing codes for parents versus private providers.

Private pay services are not held to the same medical billing standards as CPT codes, but those persons providing the service and credential through the ACE are still required to abide by their relevant ethics code.

There are additional ethical concerns with that parental RBT model.

the BCD published a newsletter that addressed the topic of a parent serving as their child's RBT. The BCB states that parents participating as a part of their child's treatment, whether whether it be parent training, focused intervention or more comprehensive behavior change program to assist with generalization across environments, has long been valued and shown benefits.

Analysts are also ethically required to provide effective treatment and protect clients from harm and in a parental RBT model, the behavior analyst is unlikely to be able to consistently provide independent judgment for the most effective treatment possible.

The third reason ethical reason is that the behavior analysts are ethically required to be accurate in their documentation and billing.

Anyone practicing in Nevada, whether they reside here or not, must be licensed or registered with the Nevada Board of ABA as described by NRS 641D.

There was a possibility of submitting an opinion to the governor's office to revise or look at this knack to remove any barriers to who providing services, who are autism community.
