



Program Growth

- Year-to-date FY14

- In June, 2013 there were 134 active children, ATAP currently serves 191 children.




Number of Referrals

 - 2


Pre-Referral/Referral

- **Pre-referral:** Clients in this status have expressed an interest in the program and an application has been completed. In order to proceed clients need to submit Proof of Diagnosis (77 children)
- **Referral:** Clients in this status have returned the Proof of Diagnosis; 60 days is allowed in this status to process the case, gather additional information and move client to the Waitlist (103 children)



Wait List

- **Pending:** Clients in this status have been processed and on the Waitlist (330 children)
- **In Process:** Clients in this status have been given a slot for services, but have not yet begun to utilize any services. (64 children)




Wait List Cont'd

Wait Times


- Longest number of day waiting


Plan Type by Age-Active

- **Collaboration:** assistance when collaborating with another agency to research levels of treatment or maintain the child in the least restrictive environment by cost sharing




Plan Type by Age-Active Cont'd

- **Comprehensive:** address skills across all domains daily; starts at age six (6); four (4) year plan type; twenty-five (25) hours a week of treatment; four (4) hours of monthly supervision




Plan Type by Age-Active Cont'd

- **Insurance Assistance:** family assistance in paying for co-pays or meeting yearly deductible to access insurance coverage; under the age of 19; one (1) year at a time with no maximum term limit




Plan Type by Age-Active Cont'd

- **Targeted Extensive:** addresses up to ten (10) plan targets (skills); average fifteen (15) hours a week of treatment; transition or alternative to Comprehensive Plan; starts at age six (6) or older; maximum of two (2) years in plan




Plan Type by Age-Active Cont'd

- **Transition:** addresses up to three (3) skills/behaviors; outlines a systematic decrease in Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) treatment and supervision hours; maximum of one (1) year




Plan Type by Age-Active Cont'd

- **Targeted Basic:** addresses up to three (3) plan targets (skills); designed to be short term; provider and plan determine hours of treatment and supervision monthly; typically older children; maximum of one (1) year



Plan Type by Age-Active Cont'd

- **Social Skills:** child is at a higher functioning level; completed a Comprehensive Plan; parent request; child unable to maintain friendships; and/or teen's lack of social skills interferes with community or job participation; elementary, middle and high school age
