136 Children were assessed. Below is a summary of the most significant gains in skills over the one year measurement period.

- 76 gained the ability to self monitor
- 91 gained the ability to visually discriminate
- 42 gained the ability to accept suggestions
- 40 are now able to ask appropriate questions
- 25 are now able to consistently ask for help
- 11 were able to stop aggressive or self-injurious behavior

Over fiscal year 2013 ATAP operated at maximum capacity and was only able to add cases when children exited the program. However, during that time ATAP was able to provide services to three children in order to prevent them from being placed in residential treatment out of state. Additionally, three more children have been placed in ATAP since July 2013 to also avoid placement in residential treatment.

During fiscal year 2013, 134 children were receiving services through ATAP. 48 children received 25-30 hours of intervention per week. 44 children received 15-20 hours of treatment per week. 42 children utilized services that combined parent and child training and intervention that was typically 10 hours per week.

Vocational Rehabilitation
August 2013 Report on Services for Persons with Autism

In 2013, Vocational Rehabilitation (VR) served 205 clients with a diagnosis of Autism.

- 26 clients had successful employment outcomes
 - Average number of hours per week: 29
 - 10 clients were employed for 40 hours per week
 - 4 clients were employed for 30-32 hours per week
 - 12 clients worked fewer than 30 hours per week
 - Average rate of pay: \$9
 - Max was \$15 (1 client)
 - Min was \$7.25 (1 client)
- \$276,391 was spent on services
 - 1 Assistive Technology
 - 4 Counseling
 - 6 Diagnosis and Treatment (3 medicine, 3 visual)
 - 8 Information and Referral
 - 5 Interpreter Services (Foreign Language)
 - 78 Job Placement
 - 10 Job Search Assistance
 - 35 Maintenance (clothing, room and board, utilities assistance)
 - 53 Training
 - 34 Other Services (work cards, tools)
 - 2 Mental Health Treatment
 - 19 On the Job Supports
 - 30 Transportation
