III. Approval of the Minutes from the February 27, 2017 Meeting (For Possible Action)

Ms. Partos made a motion to approve the minutes from February 27, 2017. Ms. Gaw seconded the motion. Motion passed.

IV. Discussion and Possible Recommendations on Setting Priorities for the Subcommittee. (For Possible Action)

Diane Thorkildson, Subcommittee Chairperson

Ms. Thorkildson would like to establish priorities for the subcommittee and gain a better understanding of the recent ADSD Administration and policy changes for the ATAP program.

Ms. Adie explained, at the last full Autism Commission meeting on October 19<sup>th</sup>, ATAP presented on any upcoming changes to the program, including rate change proposals and structural modifications. Previously services were provided on a tiered system and are transitioning to an hour for hour system. There have been alternate pathways to certification for BCBAs, BCaBAs and RBTs for ATAP funded only children so providers can receive their practical experience and hours. The division received input from the community and providers at a previous meeting this month. The Autism Commission voted in full support of the proposals from ATAP. Ms. Partos commended ATAP for the attention paid and work put in to ensure availability of appropriate rural providers. ATAP is committed to transparency and continued communication with consumers and providers. ATAP has not made any changes to insurance plan types. The program helps to fund copays and deductibles and gap coverage. ATAP fully funds many rural families because of the lack of providers in network in those areas.

Autism therapy and diagnosis are covered by state employee insurance. The importance for the subcommittee is to focus on legislation and potential matters happening on a national level. The state of Nevada has a determined the minimum services state insurance companies must provide. Autism services was one of those standards. Possible changes to the Affordable Care Act could possible affect those standards. The committee can focus on educating families and spreading awareness around the changes on a federal level. The Association for Behavioral Analysis International (ABAI) is a resource for information regarding national issues.

Established subcommittee priorities:

- Federal decision making on ACA matters
- Recommendations for self-funded insurance programs in Nevada
- Eventually bring recommendations to the full commission and to the Governor's office.
- Dr. Gaspar De Alba is currently working on the Governor's report due in December.

Ms. Partos made a motion to develop the top priorities as recommendations to the Governor's Report related to the coverage of ABA and the requirement of self-funded plans to cover ABA. Ms. Adie seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Ms. Thorkildson has agreed to research "Autism Speaks" and draft talking points and policy statements for the Subcommittee's next meeting.

Ms. Partos will research the different advocacy groups she is in association with and present information at the next meeting.

Ms. Gaw made a motion to amend Ms. Partos motion to include a recommendation researching possibilities for additional therapies that are evidence based, besides ABA, to be funded by ATAP. Ms. Partos amended her original motion to include the research of other therapies. Ms. Gaw seconded the motion. Motion passed. Ms. Gaw will research other possible behavior based therapies that ATAP funding could be used toward.
