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Innovation Grants

- Older American Act Enhancement – \$850,000 for Innovative Projects (approximate)
 - Food Security - \$152,514 (Title III B)
 - Transportation - \$229,770 (Title III B)
 - Disease Prevention and Health Promotion - \$81,740
 - Caregiver Support - \$391,974

Innovation Grants – The Response

Competitive Grant Cycle

- History
 - 10 Core Services
 - Older American Act funding, Independent Living funds, and State General Funds
 - 2 year project periods
 - Funding Distribution
 - East 3%
 - North 19%
 - South 39%
 - Multi-County 39%
- FY2017-18 Basis of Recommendations
 - Performance of current grantees
 - Waitlist of grantees (self-reported)
 - Cost per client/unit
 - Service Gaps and Access to Service

 - New Partnerships
 - Rural Services
 - Expanding Project Periods
 - Collaboration with Office of Community Partnerships and Grants
- Timeline
 - New Grant Period Start: 7/1/19
 - Post Request for Applications: 1/15/19
 - Applications Due: 2/15/19
 - Recommendations to Administrator: 4/15/19
 - Notice of Sub-Awards: 6/15/19

State Plan for Aging Services - Goals

- Older Adult Nevadans and their families are empowered to make informed decisions about long-term services and supports (LTSS) through coordinated, person-centered services.

- ADSD is responsive to older adult Nevadans' needs through continuous quality improvement and standardized quality measures.
- Older Adult Nevadans receive long-term services and supports through a trained and expanded workforce.

State Plan for Aging Services – Accomplishments

- **Additional Accomplishments since March 2018**
 - CBC and DHCFP collaborating on training for HCBS Waiver providers
 - Hosted Public Workshops re: Assisted Living Rate increase
 - CBC social workers trained to conduct SNAP eligibility interviews
 - Wrapping up Self-Directed Transportation Voucher pilot project
 - Elder Protective Services – awarded two grants to move towards Adult Protective Services

Federal Grants – Pending

- **Innovations in Nutrition Services - \$499,923** Goals: Implement What a Waste, Senior Center modernization, and peer support
 - Project start date: 9/30/18 (2 year project)
- **No Wrong Door Business Case Development - \$1,187,487**
 - Cooperative Agreement to build business case for NWD.
 - Goals: IT infrastructure, website modernization, and nursing home diversion
 - Project start date: 9/30/18 (2 year project)

Federal Grants - Pending

- Training and Services to End Violence against Women with Disabilities project - \$471,771
 - Goals: Training to sexual and domestic violence advocacy organizations, outreach to disability advocacy organizations, and education for people with disabilities
 - Project start date: 9/30/18 (3 year project)
- Medicare Improvements for Patients and Providers Act (MIPPA)
 - Goals: outreach and assistance enrolling in Medicare Savings Programs and Low Income Subsidy, education on Medicare preventive services
 - Project start date: 10/1/18

New Medicare Cards

- Current Medicare numbers = Social Security number
- New Medicare number = Medicare Beneficiary Identifier (MBI)
 - NOT Social Security number
- Mailings in Waves
 - Nevada second to last wave, new cards are starting to go out this month
