#### Registered providers are responsible for:

- Reporting employment information (for educational interpreters only)
- Remaining current on their professional development plans and plans for mentoring (if required)
- ✓ Updating their contact information with the Registry
- ✓ Updating the Registry of changes in their assessment or certification status
- Renewing their registration every 3 years (for noncertified interpreters), or every 5 years (for certified interpreters)
- ✓ Providing proof of registration

#### **Exceptions**:

Those who provide services only for:

- Nonprofit civil or religious organizations,
- An emergency medical situation,
- Occasional social situations where a qualified provider is not required (according to the ADA or section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973)
- Broadcast (applies only to CART or realtime captioning providers)
