## Project Background/ Landscape

Nevada Aging and Disability Services Division (ADSD) was awarded funding for this project through a grant from the Administration for Community Living (ACL) through its 2016 Alzheimer's Disease Initiative (ADI) – Specialized Supportive Services (SSS) Program.

## This project will address services gaps in at least 3 of the 4 service gap areas:

1) Effective supports and services to persons living alone with ADRD in the community  2) Effective care and supportive services to persons living with moderate to severe impairment from ADRD and their caregiver

 3) Improve quality and effectiveness of programs and services dedicated to individuals aging with
 D intellectual and developmental disabilities with ADRD.

4) Delivery of behavioral symptom management training and expert consultation for family caregivers.

# Nevada Facts and Statistics

Historically, Nevada led the nation in growth rate in the number of people age 65 and older

Alzheimer's disease is the 6<sup>th</sup> leading cause of death (30.2 resident deaths per 100,000)

45,000 Nevadan's living with Alzheimer's Disease; projected to increase by 42.2% to 64,000 in 2025.

149,000 unpaid caregivers, 169,000 Hours of unpaid care caring for someone with dementia in Nevada. This represents \$2.136 <u>B</u>illion in 2017. That is \$243,835 an hour or \$67.73 per second.

Purpose: To sustain Dementia Friendly Nevada activities beyond the funding level. Create a sub group of the Dementia Friendly Nevada Statewide Workgroup to focus on developing an infrastructure to support our Dementia Friendly Nevada efforts.







#### Dementia Community Needs Survey Strengths and Gaps

Key **strengths** reported:

- Support groups for family care partners
- Specific Community-based organizations
- Community-based supports

Key gaps/ weaknesses reported, Lack of:

- Geriatric/ Clinical Services
- Dementia education programs
- Access to Community-based services: Support groups, transportation, and long-term care options

Overall, Nevada residents reported 75% positive attitudes toward individuals living with dementia, with a score of 105 out of 140.

Dementia Community Needs Survey – **Dementia Attitude Scale (DAS)** 

With a possible range of 12 - 84, Nevada residents scored a 60 (71%) on the social comfort subscale.

With a possible range of 8 - 56, Nevada residents scored a 45 (80%) on the dementia knowledge subscale.
