
#### ATAP Caseload

#### Monthly caseload for January 2022

- 83 new applications
- 941 active children, average age: 9 years old
- 76 total inactive children:
  - 63 Straight ATAP Average age of 5.5 years old
  - 13 Service Coordination Average age of 7.7 years old
- Average wait time for all ATAP children (days from application start date to the date the child drops or becomes active):
  - 93 Days




#### ATAP Caseload Growth



The chart above demonstrates the active caseload and waitlist averages over time. These numbers are derived from the CLEO report.




### Waitlist Elimination Progress

#### Trend in Wait Time




The graph above demonstrates the average number of days waiting for children who are "Pending" or "In Process" to become either "Active" or "Dropped" in the program.

<sup>\*\*</sup> Please note, no new referrals are included in these averages, a change from previous presentations.


#### **New Referrals**



The chart above demonstrates the number of new referrals entering the ATAP system.






This chart shows the comparison between Straight ATAP and Medicaid Caseload (Service Coordination).



#### Professional Growth - BCBA Level




The chart above shows the trend in growth of professional service providers.
