
ATAP Caseload

Monthly caseload for June 2022

- 71 new applications
- 974 active children, average age: 8.7 years old
- 8 total inactive children:
 - 5 Straight ATAP Average age of 5.3 years old
 - 3 Service Coordination Average age of 4.6 years old
- Average wait time for all ATAP children (days from application start date to the date the child drops or becomes active):
 - 33 Days




ATAP Caseload Growth



The chart above demonstrates the active caseload and waitlist averages over time. These numbers are derived from the CLEO report.




Waitlist Elimination Progress

Trend in Wait Time




The graph above demonstrates the average number of days waiting for children who are "Pending" or "In Process" to become either "Active" or "Dropped" in the program.

^{**} Please note, no new referrals are included in these averages, a change from previous presentations.


New Referrals



The chart above demonstrates the number of new referrals entering the ATAP system.




Straight ATAP & Service Coordination



This chart shows the comparison between Straight ATAP and Medicaid Caseload (Service Coordination).


Professional Growth - BCBA Level
