"Good afternoon, my name is Sherry Bond and I am with Nevada Medicaid Behavioral Health Benefits Team. Medicaid would like to make this commission aware of a public hearing regarding our applied behavioral analysis policy and state plans scheduled for March 26, 2024 at 10:00am.

I would like to place a link to our public notices page in the chat. The state plan changes include expansion of ABA services to all eligible recipients.

The policy changes include the use of ABA services for all eligible Medicaid recipients, regardless of age. Also adding clarifying language to the policy for service limitations, testing, and diagnosis requirements.

DAAY was created in 2018 to divert children or youth on the spectrum, or suspected to be on the spectrum, out of the criminal justice system

- Provide assessments/services to youths who are in the delinquency system
- Help families in the community and at home
- Work in conjunction with volunteers (Probation Officer, DA, Public Defender, BCBA, ATAP, DRC services)
- Recidivism rate is 7
- Funding through court assessments
 - Neuro Psych to work with those who are high risk
 - o Inclusion Fusion for socialization
 - o Parent Training, BSR, PST
 - Counseling Program (Hard Kocks)
- SB411
 - Allows each county to seek funding and create same type of diversionary program as DAAY
- 6. **For Information:** Autism Treatment Assistance Program (ATAP) Updates

Month-month data has not changed.

- Increase in caseload is minimal
- 7. <u>For Information</u>: Presentation from Sierra Regional Center, Management Analyst for Statewide Updates on Service Provisions from the Regional Centers for Individuals with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD).
 - Works with individuals with autism as a primary diagnosis and also works with individuals with intellectual disabilities, developmental disabilities, or related conditions.

- Currently have about 8,200 individuals with open cases across three regional centers
 - About 2,220 individuals with autism as primary diagnosis
- Have 2 Supported Living Arrangement (SLA) types
 - 1) Intermittent Support
 - Individual living at home with family who is supported by a contracted provider periodically.
 - About 2,200 receiving SLA services
 - 2) Intensive Support
 - Individual living with housemates and cared for/supervised by paid staff 24/7
 - About 1,600 receiving ISLA srevices
- Currently have 54 providers across the state that provide SLA services
- Typical case load per case manager is 45-46

Funds have been approved to have survey translated. Work order process will take time. Using professional translation service to translate survey.
