June 30, 2024.



ATAP Caseload

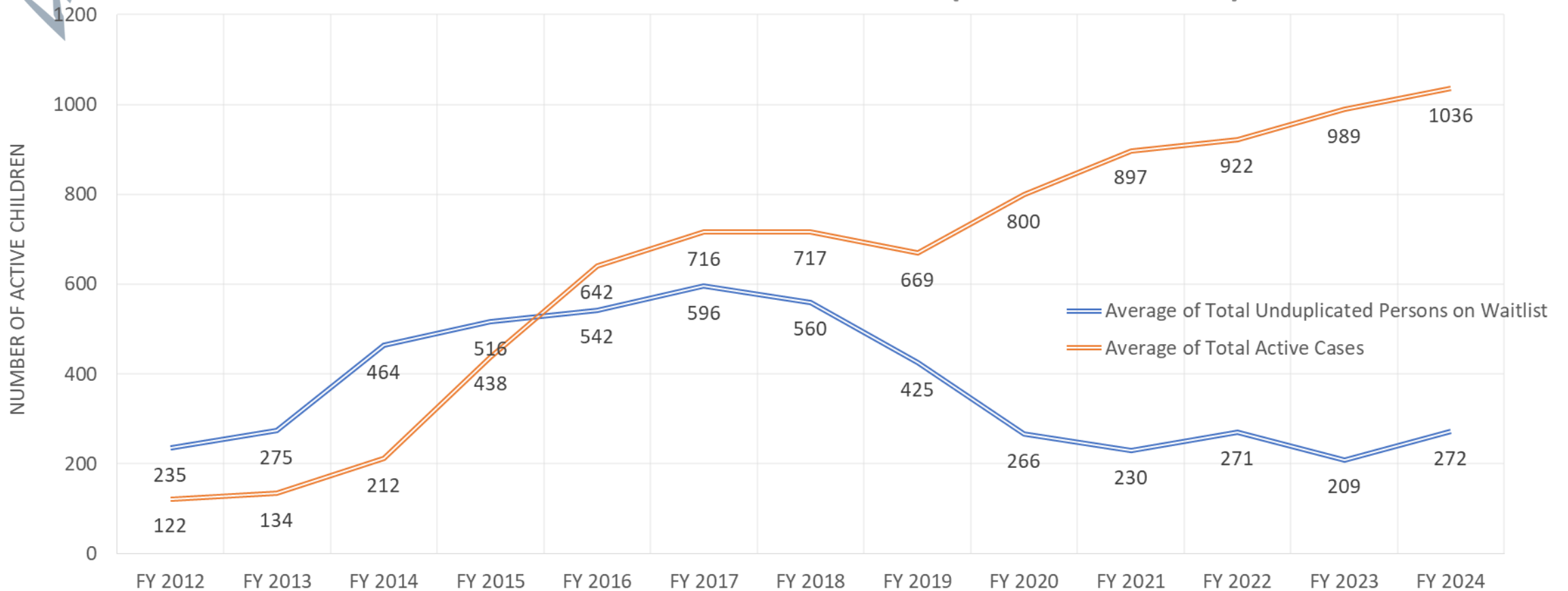
Monthly caseload for June 2024

- 80 new applications
- 1,063 active children, average age: 8.6 years old
- 37 total inactive children:
 - 27 Straight ATAP – Average age of 6.4 years old
 - 10 Service Coordination
- Average wait time for all ATAP children (*days from application start date to the date the child drops or becomes active*):
 - 58 Days

ATAP CASELOAD FY2012 - FY2024 (YEAR TO DATE)



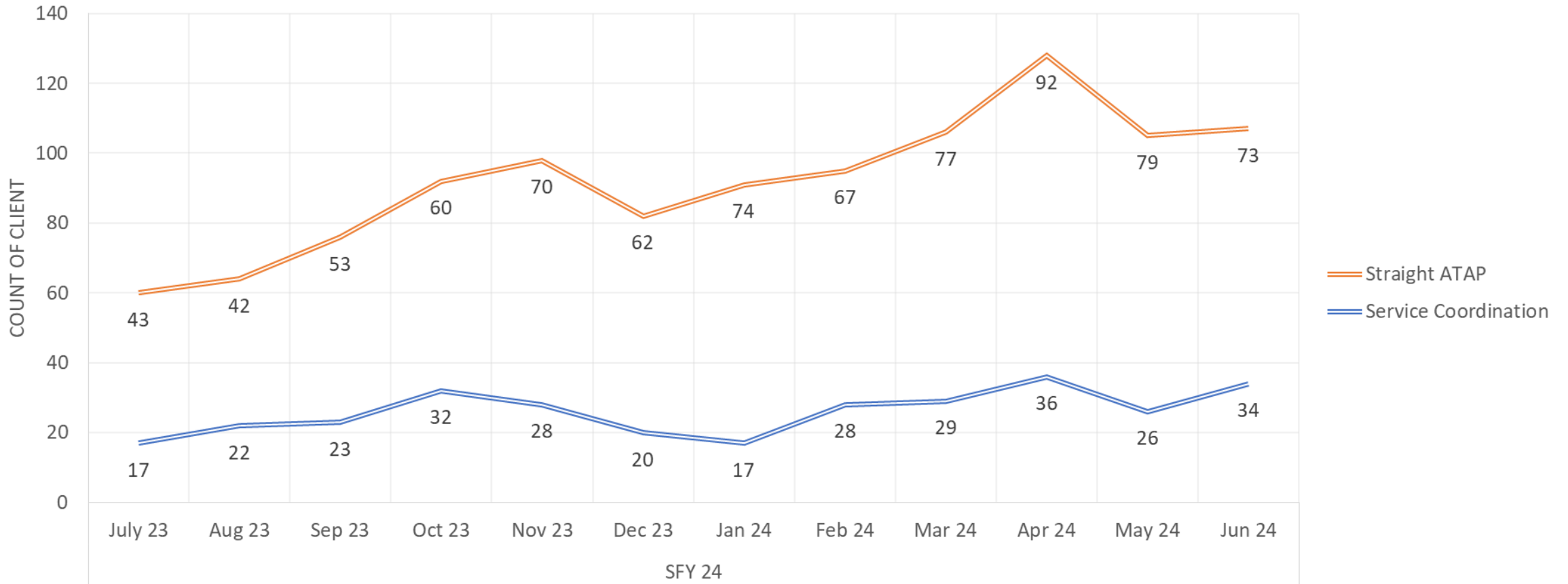
The chart above demonstrates the active caseload and waitlist averages over time. These numbers are derived from the CLEO report.

JULY 2023 - JUNE 2024

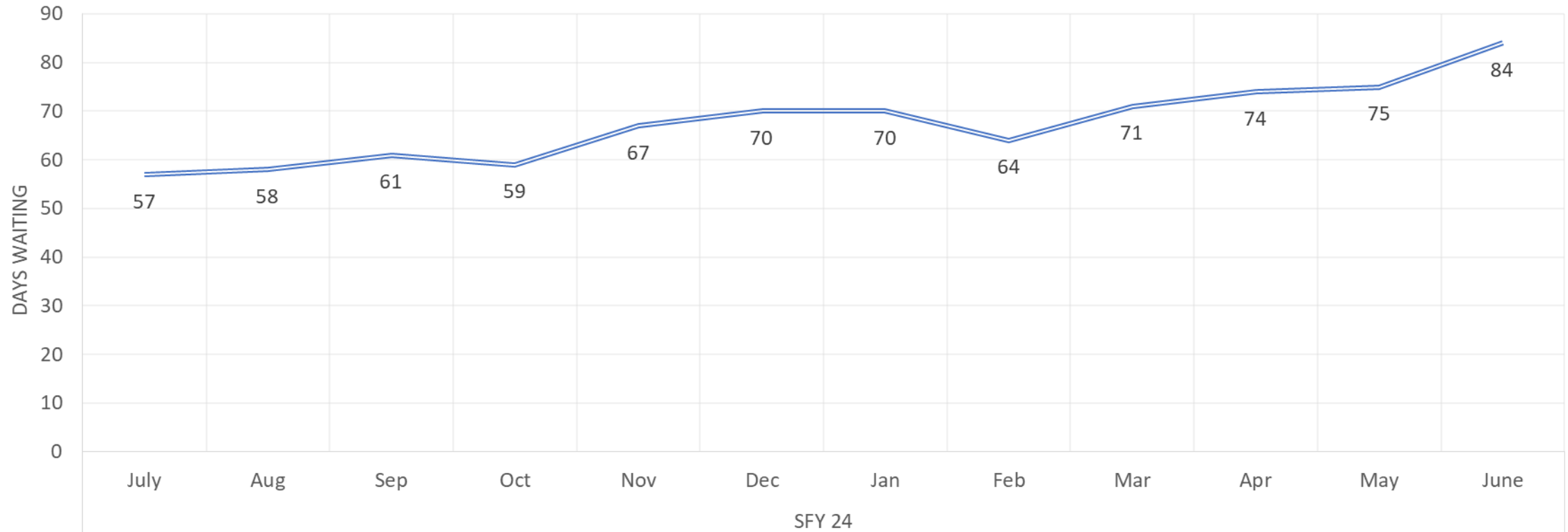


The graph above shows the monthly waitlist as occurred from July 2023 through June 2024.

The graph above demonstrates the number of days waiting for children who are “Pending” or “In Process” to become either “Active” or “Dropped” in the program.

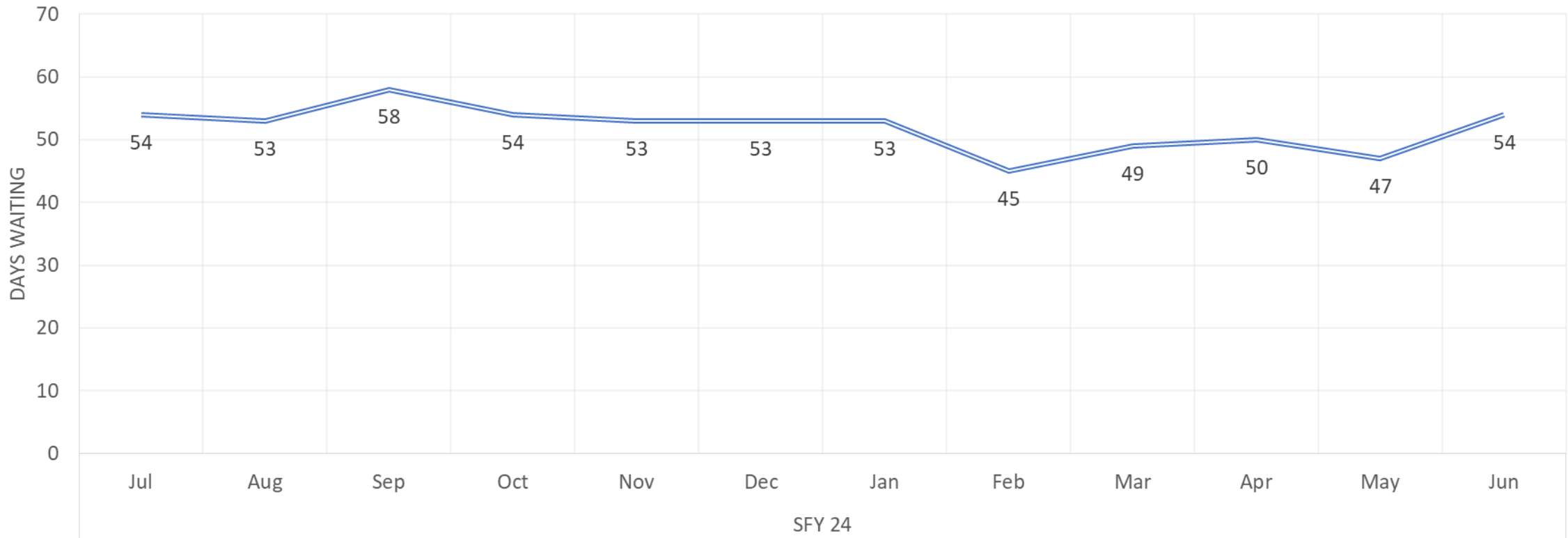

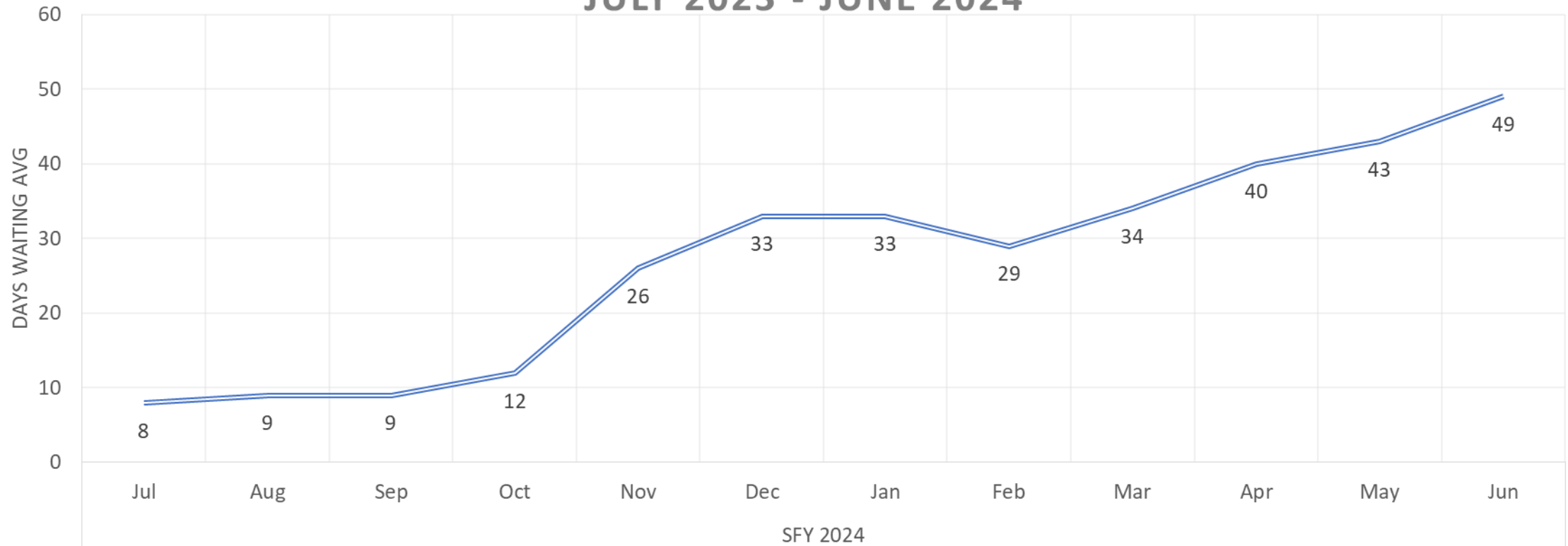

The graph above demonstrates the number of days waiting for children from “In Process” to become either “Active” or “Dropped” in the program.

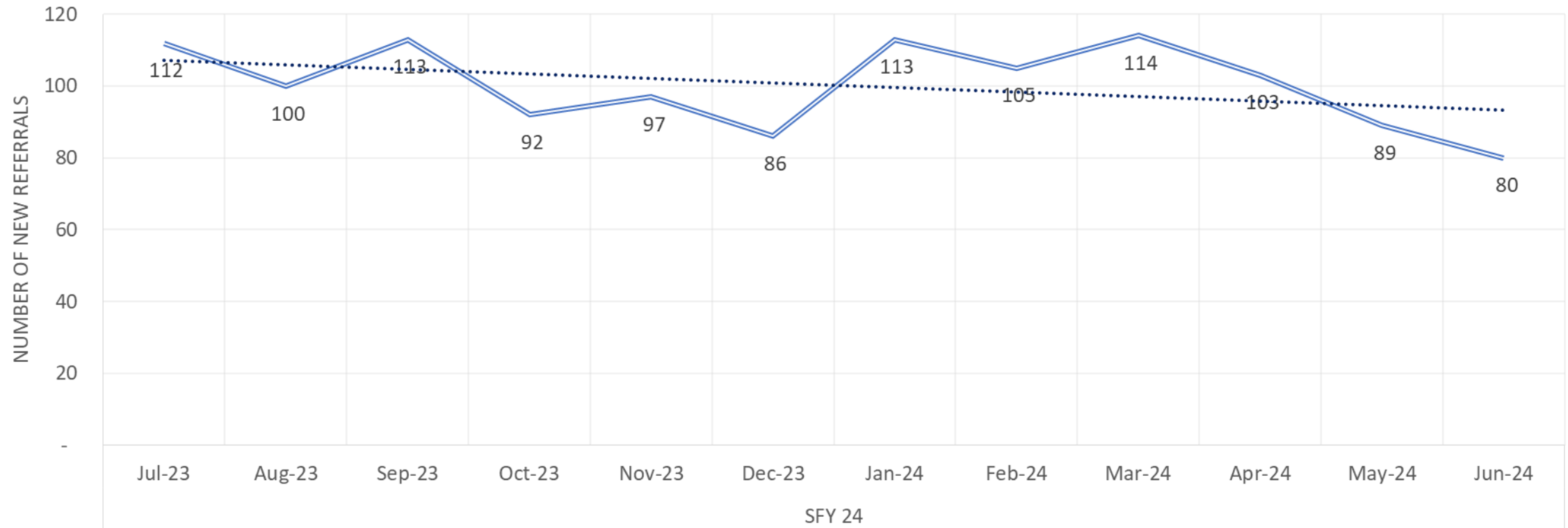

NEW REFERRALS JULY 2023 - JUNE 2024

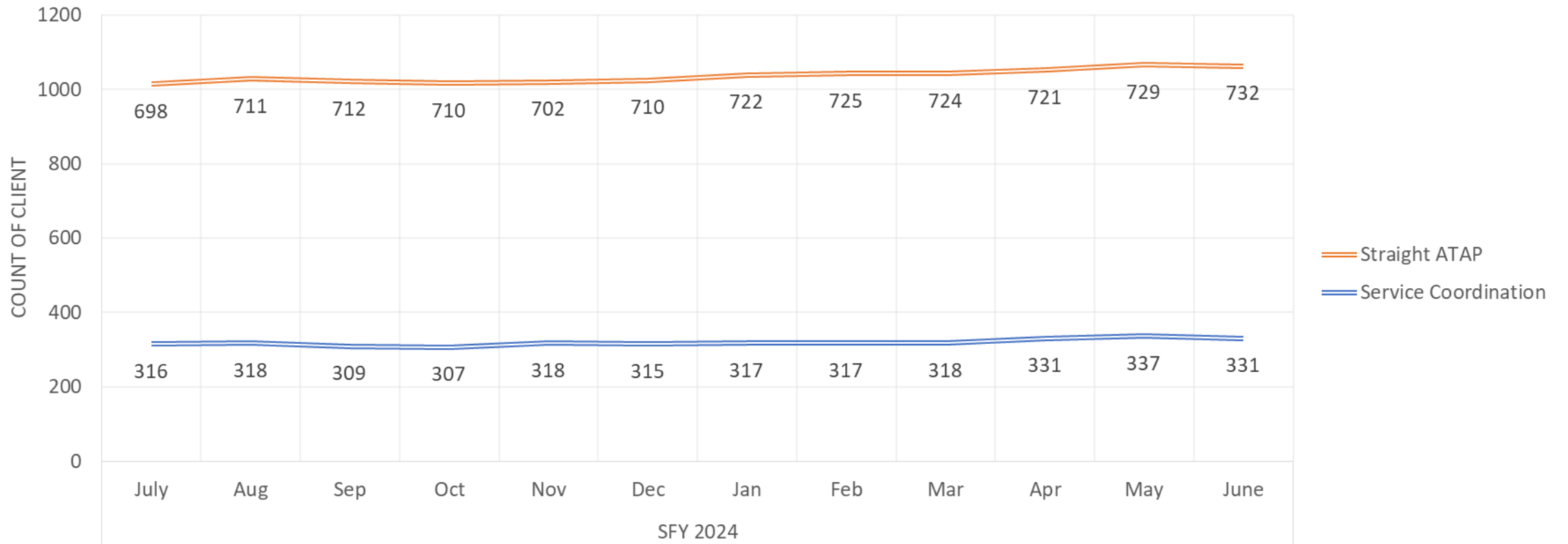


The chart above demonstrates the number of new referrals entering the ATAP system.

STRAIGHT ATAP & SERVICE COORDINATION JULY 2023 - JUNE 2024

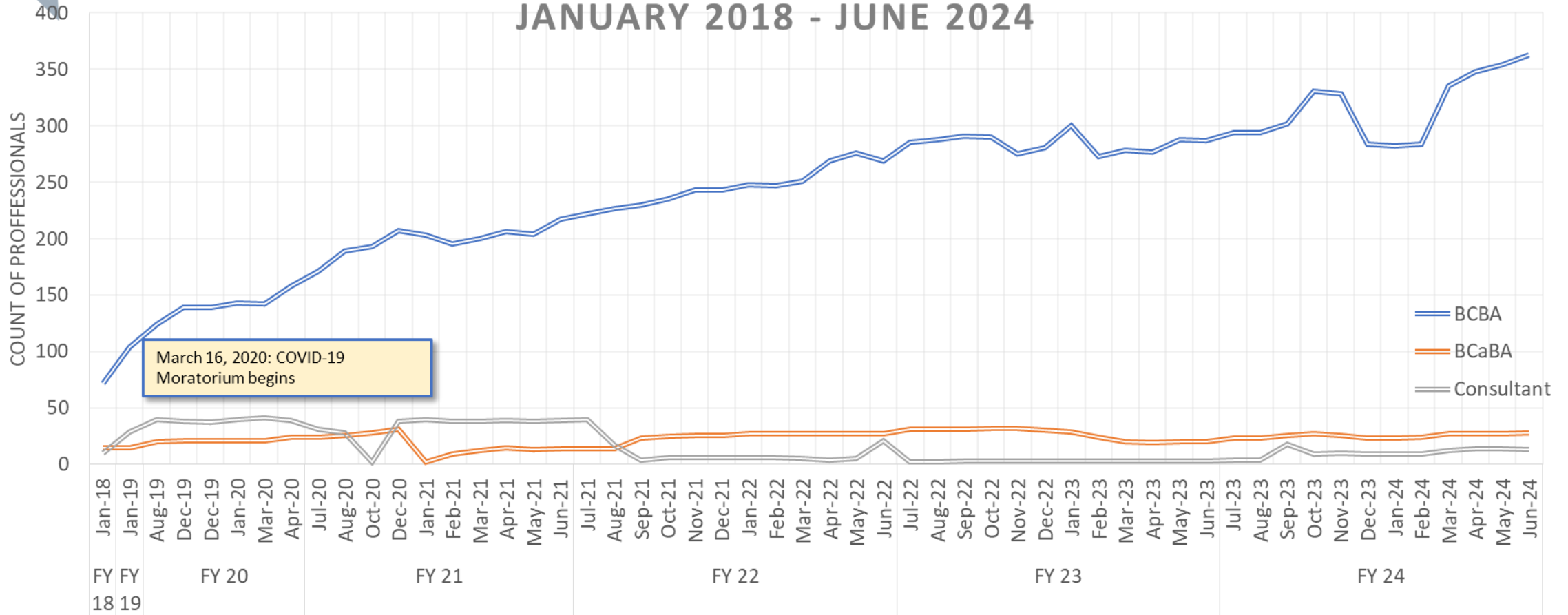


This chart shows the comparison between Straight ATAP and Medicaid Caseload (Service Coordination).

TREND IN PROFESSIONAL SERVICE PROVIDERS JANUARY 2018 - JUNE 2024



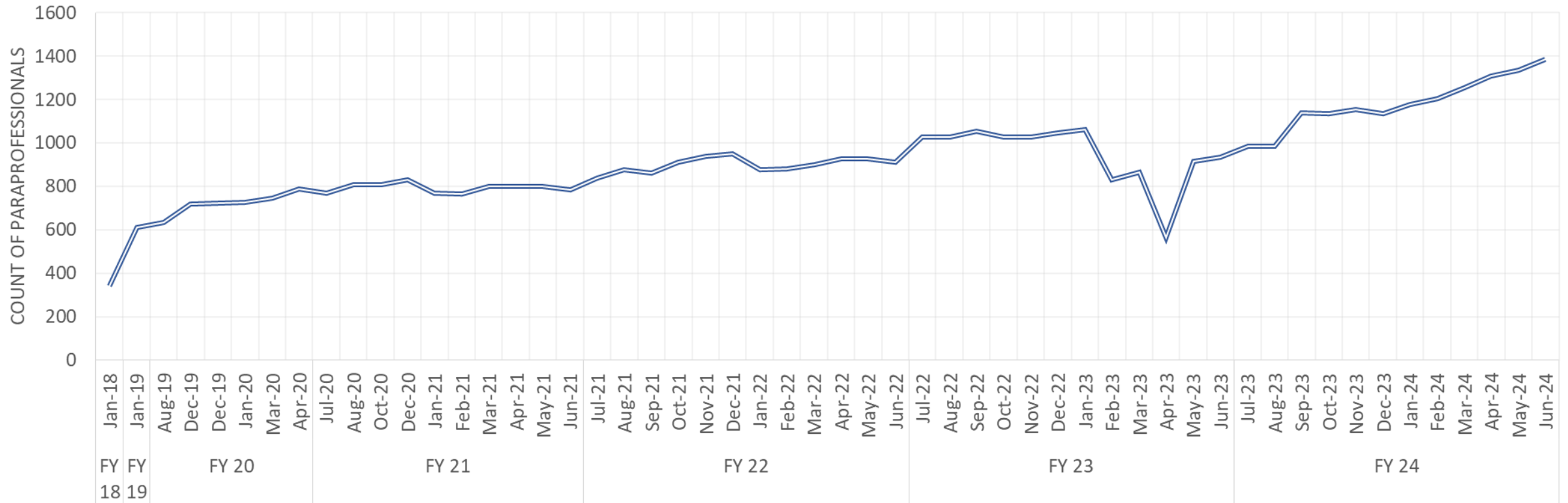
The chart above shows the trend in growth of professional service providers.
