SRx/DRx Program & Medicare Part D History

- 1999 Senior Rx (SRx) established
- 2005 Disability Rx (DRx) established
- 2006 Medicare Part D introduced, includes GAP phase where beneficiary pays 100% of cost of pharmaceuticals while in the GAP

SRx/DRx program aligns with new Medicare Part D, provides pharmaceutical coverage during Part D coverage gap and monthly subsidy toward Part D premium

2010 – Affordable Care Act passes and begins elimination of Part D coverage gap



History cont.

- 2018 Bipartisan Budget Act of 2018 passes and requires pharmaceutical companies to give same discounts to Medicare beneficiaries as to insurance providers and pharmacies
- 2019 GAP closed for brand name drugs
- 2020 GAP closed for both brand name and generic drugs
- 2020 SRx/DRx Program aligns with Medicare to provide Part D Premium Subsidy only



SRx/DRx Program Today

- Provide monthly subsidy of up to \$37 toward a member's Medicare Part D premium or a member's Part D portion of their Medicare Advantage Plan Premium
- Maximum member benefit per year = \$444
- Average subsidy paid by the SRx/DRx program per member in Medicare Plan Year 2020 = \$29.52
- Average member benefit per year =\$354.25

Direct Service (subsidy)	\$311,328
Administrative	\$205,170*
Total	\$516,498

*40% of program budget



Budget Planning Considerations

- COVID-19 and State Budget Crisis
- ADSD's proposed budget
 - Fund SRx/DRx Program through first year of next biennium, SFY22
 - Funding to then be used to target greatest needs, as a result of budget and service cuts, by diversifying services through the Fund for a Health Nevada
- Future available funding
 - Evaluate needs of Nevadans; prescription, dental, vision, etc and reinstate program
 - 81st Legislative Session ADSD BDR to revise NRS to allow more flexibility in administration of the program
