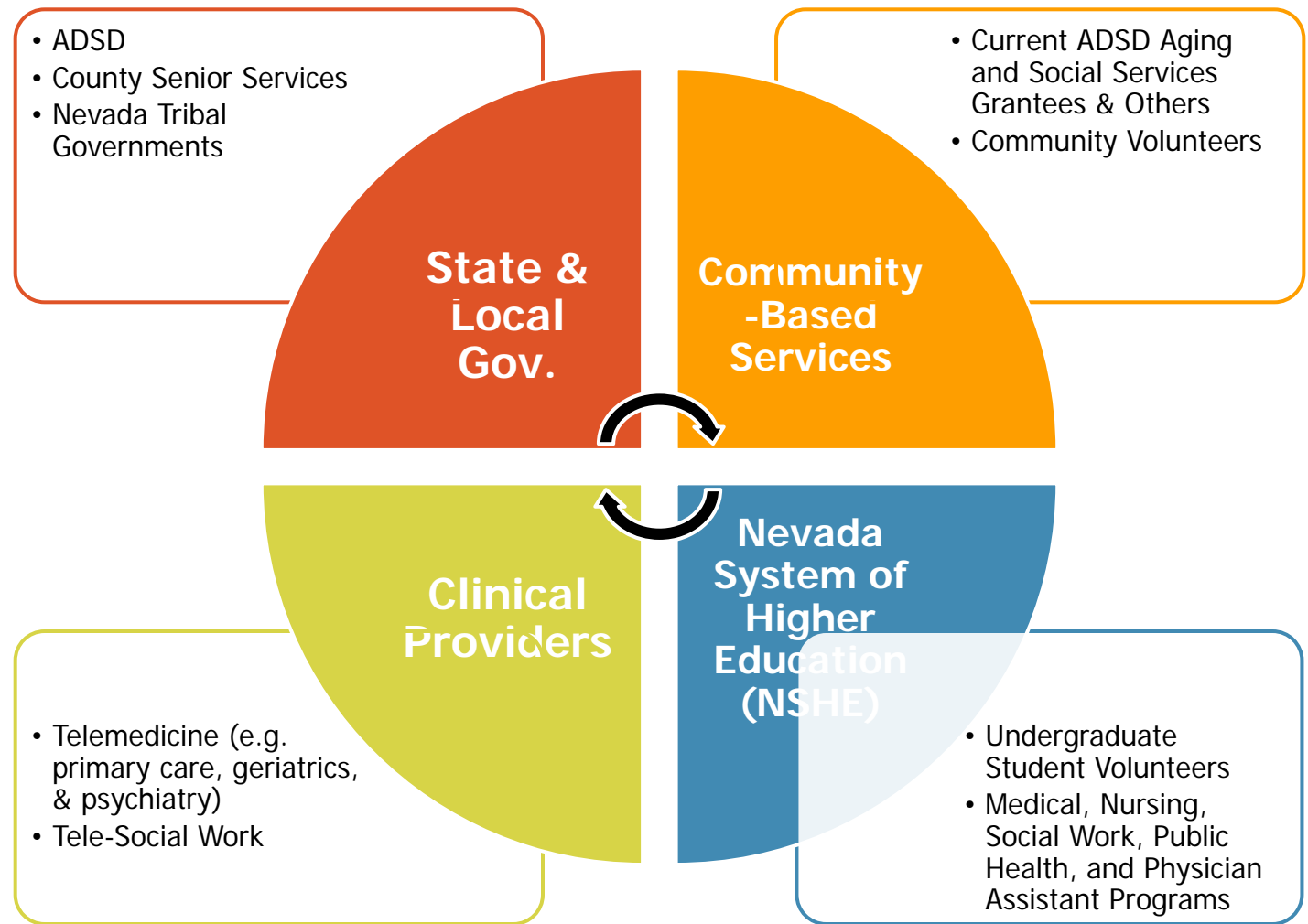

What is Nevada CAN?

The Nevada COVID-19 Aging Network (Nevada CAN) rapid response effort is a statewide, inter-organizational collaboration of many aging services organizations, led by the Nevada Aging and Disability Services Division (ADSD).





Our Goal

To mobilize all available resources and ensure that Nevadans have **access to medical, social and daily essential items at home**, reducing risk of exposure to and impact of COVID-19.

OBJECTIVES



- Provide **credible information** and resource availability.
- Utilize student and community volunteers to **connect with elders** via phone or internet-based technology to:
 - Check on basic, medical, and social service needs
 - Engage them in meaningful social interaction
- Assess for individual needs for basic essentials, including:
 - **Food, medication, pet food, medical supplies, etc.**
- Connect county senior service agencies and non-profit organizations with volunteers to **fulfill individual needs through home delivery of essential items**
- **Deliver essential clinical services** via telehealth, including:
 - Social work, primary care, geriatric assessment, and psychiatric care

2. Volunteers are needed to support our seniors during this time of self isolation.



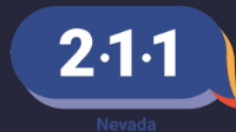
