

## Commission on Aging Long Term Care Ombudsman Report May 17, 2022

- 1) The Ombudsman has struggled with a vacancy rate over 50%. As of May 16<sup>th</sup>, 19 of the 20 ombudsman positions are filled. This will allow the program to spend more time with residents while conducting visits and providing advocacy to residents.
- 2) Cases statistics for April 22:

156 cases opened statewide

Reno District 31 cases

- 3) The Ombudsman program is working on marketing strategies to inform the public and residents about the Long Term Care Ombudsman program in hopes to increase resident access to the program.
