What is Olmstead

- 1999 Supreme Court Decision reaffirmed Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990
 - Public entities must ensure people with disabilities are offered the opportunity to live in the most integrated settings possible.
- A working plan must provide:
 - An analysis of the extent to which the public entity is providing services in the most integrated settings
 - Concrete and reliable commitments to expand integrated opportunities.
 - Specific, reasonable timeframes and measurable goals to be held accountable
 - Funding to support the plan



Project Status

- September 2022: Initial consumer survey completed by UNR.
- November 2022 January 2023: Kickoff with Social Entrepreneurs Inc, data gathering and system description.
- January April 2023: Consumer Workshops and Key Informant Interviews
- May June 2023: Develop Assets and Gaps, Critical Issues
- July September 2023: Finalize Goals, Objectives, and Strategies
- October 2023: Present plan for public feedback
- November 2023: Finalize and publish plan



Assets & Gaps

- Assets
 - Focus on community-integration
 - Partnership with providers
 - Engaging people with lived experience
 - Co-location of services
 - Legislative support
 - Pending rate increases

Gaps

- Fractured and complex system
- Lack of sufficient and flexible funding
- Workforce shortages and sufficiency
- Inadequate data collection and sharing across programs
- Limited knowledge of service availability
- Lack of understanding of Olmstead Decision
- Gaps in services for people with disabilities



Critical Issues

- Center Inclusion and Accountability integrate the disability community into every aspect of the ADSD service system; piloting a culture of inclusion in all aspects of the system
- Improve Knowledge Sharing establish clear, complete, and accessible method of information sharing, make information about community providers publicly available
- **Prioritize ADSD Workforce Supports** address barriers to encourage a full and sustainable workforce, prioritize expectations to work from a preventive position
- Focus on Data Collection and CQI establish standard data collection efforts
- **Develop a Statewide Solution** –advocate, coordinate and facilitate a multidisciplinary planning group to address the needs of individuals with disabilities.
