## Interim Session Priorities:

- 1. Advocate for more diverse representation on the Commission in efforts to support marginalized communities within the D/HH population.
- 2. Advocate for the restructure of the Commission to be housed under the Governor Office to support the autonomy of the Commission, and their efforts to provide more succinct service to the target population.
- 3. Work with DETR to increase accessible services to the Deaf/HoH population; including but not limited to:
  - a. Staff fluent in ASL to better support Deaf/ HoH clients
  - b. Improve web accessibility efforts to support consumer experience when accessing information.
- 4. Revisit plan for potential Deaf School in efforts to support Deaf/ HoH children and bolster a more inclusive environment that is accommodating to their needs.
- 5. Unemployment division inaccessibility for D/HH claimants
- 6. DETR pulling temporary D/HH access to UI without providing alternative means for community members.
- 7. Lack of employer awareness/responsibility in providing ADA accessible application, interview, and onboarding of D/HH workers
- 8. Consistent case manager service provider for D/HH Nevadans
- Limited access to personal equipment and training for tech savvy needs of today's day-to-day operations
- 10. Inconsistent captioning and ASL interpreter access across public platforms
- 11. Equality setbacks due to mask mandates and failure to provide reasonable accommodations
