#### **INCEPTION**

- Initial working group started in 2015
  - Andrea Juillerat-Olvera
  - Gary Olsen
  - Jennifer Montoya
  - Gina burnaugh
  - Evan Adair
- Proposal was brought to the Legislature and well received
- UNR's Speech Pathology Dept rejected the proposal

# WORLD LANGUAGES AND LITERATURE

- The World Languages and Literature Department at UNR took control of ASL in Spring of 2022
- The proposal was reintroduced and accepted with enthusiasm
- Other UNR administrative officials have expressed support
- Current program design spearheaded by Andrea Juillerat-Olvera
- **Professor Cal Adair** is also contributing to the effort and will be the first new instructor hired for the program.

## CHALLENGES IN NORTHERN NEVADA

- The program is a coordinated effort to address challenges for Deaf Community of Northern Nevada:
  - Lack of sign language interpreters
  - Institutions public/private are non-compliant with ADA law (for lack of resources)
  - Deaf people face continual challenges to accessibility in daily life
  - No Deaf service center in Northern Nevada
  - Washoe County School District struggles to provide adequate support

#### A TWO-FOLD MISSION

- 1. Train a cadre of interpreters to work in our communities
  - Homegrown resources to meet local demand
- 2. Engage the Deaf Community as part of the program's implementation
  - Work force development for Deaf and HoH individuals
  - Tutor-Trading with K-12 dDeaf students to improve transition to higher ed
  - Create a locus of support for Deaf people on campus
  - Inspire new/emerging leadership in the Deaf Community of Northern Nevada

#### PHASE ONE

- First, we must implement a minor in ASL/Deaf Studies:
- Demonstrate student interest with enrollment numbers
  - Currently, there are 60 ASL 4 students enrolled in Spring 2023 (8 on waiting lists)
  - One summer session in ASL 4 will post to recruit more interested students
  - Once minor courses hit the course catalog, our PR campaign can begin
    - Navigate software system for directed email blasts
    - Social media
    - Fliers and outreach
  - predicted enrollment for minor? 25 30 students

### PHASE ONE, CONTINUED...

- Prove our ability to educate effectively with completion rates
- Post-program evaluation (ASLPI through Gallaudet University)
  - Four students will be chosen to take the ASLPI to demonstrate effective instruction
- Establish a connection with the Deaf Community on campus
  - Begin the Deaf Community Participation Initiative
    - Dependent upon grant funding
- Garner data for the future of the program
  - First year stats we can build on

# DEAF COMMUNITY PARTICIPATION INITIATIVE

- Cultivate and maintain a strong working relationship with the Deaf Community in Northern Nevada.
- Rationale:
- There is no "Deaf Country"
  - Immersion experiences must be generated locally
- The Deaf population is extremely diverse
  - Variety of sign systems, consumers with co-occurring disabilities, immigrant influx
- Native sign language user are necessary to provide exposure and guidance to our students.

# DEAF COMMUNITY PARTICIPATION INITIATIVE

- A Jobs Development Program
- Funding is sought for the following positions/projects:
  - Deaf Teaching Assistants (TAs)
  - Deaf Tutors
  - Deaf-lead immersion weekends every spring
  - The creation of a video library of Deaf perspectives, stories and insights
  - Deaf consultation on curriculum and implementation

- Fall 2023
- Deaf Tutors/TAs two or more part time workers
- 40 hours a week @ \$20/hour = \$800/week
- 13 weeks  $\times$  \$800 = \$10,400
- University F&A cost = \$4,888
- Spring Semester Total = \$15,288

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- Video Library Development Fund for Academic year 23/24
- \$50 for Each video that meets all formatting and standardization requirements: 3-5 minutes in length, studio quality lighting/editing, adhering to one or more of the topic categories. Our goal is to collect an average of 40 videos each year for the first several years of the program.
- Goal: 40 videos x \$50/each = \$2,000
- University F&A cost = \$940
- *First Year Total* = \$2,940

#### Immersion Weekend

- Two or three Deaf Coordinators @ \$250/each = \$750
- Lodging for 12-16 people @ \$500/night x 2 nights = \$1,000
- Students who participate will be asked to share costs for food, transportation and extracurricular activities.
  - \*final cost to be determined closer to the date when head counts can be verified.
- Base cost estimate for program dispersal = \$1,750
- University F&A costs \$822.50
- First year budget for immersion weekend = \$2,572.50

- Guest Presenter Stipend
- One Deaf presenter @ \$500/each = \$500
- University F&A costs = \$235
- Presenter first year Total = \$735
- ASLPI Student Assessment Interview
- Four student interviews to evaluate proficiency @ \$165/each = \$660

- Total Grant Request for First Academic Year:
- ·\$36,823.50

# PHASE TWO: INTERPRETER TRAINING PROGRAM

- Pending a successful first year with our minor, we will propose a major that bestows a Bachelors degree in American Sign Language Interpretation.
- Continued grant seeking activities to support and grow our Deaf Community Participation Initiative.
- The program will request funding for a full-time teaching position for a Deaf instructor.
  - Ideally a CDI or otherwise qualified individual to assist with the interpreting program.
    - Source: soft funding or departmental budget allocation

#### RECIPROCITY

- Service Learning and General Reciprocity is the guiding principle of our program.
- The Deaf Community helps train our interpreters
- Our interpreters volunteer to assist the Deaf Community
- Service Learning is a require component of the course work in each phase.
- An agreement with Washoe County School District has already been reached.

#### **BRIDGE BUILDING**

- This proposal aims to build working bridges between several entities:
- From the program to the social service sector
- From the program to the Deaf community
- From the Deaf Community to campus in the aim of improved transition/retention of students in higher education...
  - and for the cultivation of emerging leadership.
- Benefits are aimed at Deaf and hearing people...
  - on and off campus.

#### **OUTCOMES**

- Create local jobs for Deaf and hearing alike.
- Build social capital within and between communities as we work toward a common goal.
- Act as a locus of support for the Deaf community by example, and in practice.
- Relieve the burden of many public and private institutions that struggle to provide interpreting accommodations.
- Providing ASL/Deaf Studies as a minor for Special Education, thereby increasing the pool of TODs (Teachers of the Deaf) who are fluent in sign and culturally sensitive.
- Improve education for Deaf and Hard of Hearing children in Northern Nevada

#### SERVING NEVADANS WELL

- The challenge for Northern Nevada is justifying excellence for a small population. Even one person is worth serving well.
- The Deaf Community has fought long and hard to have a "voice"
  - to get services
  - to be educated
  - included
  - respected
