• Dementia Care Specialist (DCS) Program (#5)

- This is being combined into 1 Bill Draft Request (BDR) with the Nevada Memory Net.
- Potentially will receive a copy of the Bill language before the November bill introductions.

• Residential Long-Term Care (#6)

- Suggestion to expand training requirements increasing the current 8 hours of training for skilled nursing, and assisted living providers to match other states requirements.
- Using the information that is currently available compare it with other states that have more training and compare the outcomes.
- $_{\odot}\,$ If available use Medicare cost for hospitalizations and medications.
- Potentially ask for an interim study and compare dementia care support data from other states.

• Caregiver Support (#7)

 Recommendation base on new GUIDE Model from (CMS) to increase the amount given on the voucher program for caregivers.

- Suggestions to continue use funds from the Fund for Health or the Health and Nevada Funds that are the Tabacco settlement funds.
- Dementia Training (#8)
 - Have a training process the includes a timeline when staff is to complete dementia trainings.
 - Recommended adding dementia training requirements to the first responders. Mental health counseling requirements passed in previous legislative sessions.
 - Making sure to notate specific training needed like healthcare provider requirements.
- Awareness of Dementia and the Legal Profession (#10)
 - Request to have priorities #'s 10 & 16 reviewed by the Elders Rights Attorney that may have Legislation priorities potential.
- Advance Care Planning (#16)
- Choice in Care and Care Settings (#17)
 - Dr. Carson recommended legislation funding an interim study of the admissions processes for locked and secured dementia care facilities.
 - $_{\odot}$ $\,$ Identify and standardize the assessment processes.
 - Clarification made that an interim study is what would be asked for Recommendation #17 Choice in Care and Care Settings.
 - Other avenues may be identified to assist gathering data.
- LeeAnn Mandarino moved to bring forward to TFAD's full group the recommendations and priorities discussed.
- Dr. Dylan Wint second the motion
- All approved.
