ABOUT THE PROGRAM

The CAS Mentorship Program takes a holistic approach to mentorship. The holistic approach recognizes the real-life complexities and ethical considerations that impact the interpreting process and product.

The CAS Mentorship Program Curriculum focuses on developing self-analysis skills. Self-analysis skills give interpreters the ability to assess their work product before, during, and after an interpretation.

In addition to the curriculum, the mentorship will include areas of need for each mentee. This may include, but is not limited to, ethics, professionalism, business practices, general content knowledge, and the like.

Participants should expect to spend 2 to 3 hours per week on mentoring activities, in addition to regular meetings with their mentor. The mentee may continue in the mentorship program for up to 2 years. The timeframe will depend on the individual needs of the mentee.

Participation in the program is at no-cost to the mentee. The participant must be a resident of Nevada.
